

NAADAC Approved Courses

RADACT Correspondence Courses

Ethics for Beginners -

6 Hours

This course will assist students in understanding the ethical obligations of a professional in relation to the NAADAC Code of Ethics. It is an entry level course.

Ethics for Recertification -4 Hours

This course is for students needing a refresher for re-certification

Motivational Interviewing - 16 Hours

This course focuses on the principles of motivational interviewing and the Stages of Change model developed by DiClemente and Prochaska.

Infectious Diseases and HIV/AIDS -8 Hours

This course focuses on hepatitis, sexually transmitted diseases, TB, HIV, and other infectious diseases that might impact clients receiving services.

Confidentiality -

6 Hours

This course will provide an overview of the Federal confidentiality regulations (42 CFR Part 2 and the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 (HIPAA), 45 CFR Parts 160 and 164 and the implications for behavioral health programs.

Psycho-Physiology -

This course will provide information about the brain-body connection, the nervous system structure, neuroanatomy, neurotransmitter and receptor function. The course will also discuss various drugs and their effects.



Correspondence courses are now available in CD format and in hard-copy.

Alaska History of Chemical Dependency -

6 Hours

This course provides an overview of both the history of Alaska and the introduction, use, and control of alcohol and other drugs from the time of first contact by Vitus Bering in 1742.

Introduction to Addictive Behavior - 16 Hours

This course provides an overview of the problems and consequences of substance abuse, and the importance and effectiveness of assessment procedures.

Substance Abuse Treatment for Persons with **HIV/AIDS** -10 Hours

This course provides information on HIV/AIDS, such as how it is spread, prevention, treatment, and counseling people with HIV and Substance Abuse Disorders.

Working with Diverse Populations - 16 Hours

This course discusses ethnicity, immigrants and refuges, women, disabilities, older adults, sexual orientation, adolescents, homeless populations and comorbility of alcohol and psychiatric problem

Introduction to Group Counseling -8 Hours

This course focuses on five group models that are common in substance abuse treatment, and group leadership.
